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Principal's Message

Week three of term has some exciting curriculum based and extra-curricular events. Years 11&12 careers day Tuesday, Parent Teacher Night Tuesday, Athletic Field Events Wednesday, and Track events Friday. I am always excited when these events are on because it gives students an alternative avenue to display skill and sportsmanship. These events are also occasions where teachers can build positive relationships with students outside the structure of the classroom.

Our school Cross Country was held last Friday afternoon. I was impressed with the effort of students. I was especially impressed with those students who are not natural athletes but trying their best. The challenge for students is to improve on their times from this year in next year's event.

ABBA is over for another year. This festival is a credit to the organisers and the town of Trundle in general. I was talking to a police officer on Sunday and apart from the odd person affected by alcohol there was very little to report. The band on Saturday was excellent and I am sure Carmelo from Dancing with the Stars was suitably impressed with the dance moves of Trundle locals. The minister commented that his dancing is very similar to mine before that unfortunate injury stopped a very promising career at a young age. Well done to the committee for putting in the amazing effort to organise this event.

I was interviewed by *Landline* last Friday. One of the questions was, *the best thing about Trundle*. The answer is simple. Trundle continues to maintain a sense of community. Many rural communities have forgotten about responsibilities to the collective good to their detriment. ABBA is another example of what a community working together can achieve. I am sure the current committee would greatly accept more people to help out next year.

A big thank you to our P&C members and St Patrick's P&F for running the BBQ at the hotel.

Parents of K-2 students should have received a letter explaining the FRIENDS program. This program aims to promote self-esteem, problem solving skills, psychological resilience, self-expression and building positive relations with peers and adults. There is no psychological assessment involved or diagnosis and the program does not place labels on children. One of the important functions of the school in partnership with parents is to teach students strategies from a very young age to help them cope in society and be good citizens. If we achieve this they reach their academic potential. An information session will be held Tuesday 5th May at 12:30 pm.

The Drumbeat program was due to start this term as well. Unfortunately the instructor has injured their hand and unable to play the drum. I do not know a lot about drumming but I think that could restrict your ability! This program will still run in the school but towards the end of term into term three. In term three also there is the RAGE program for 9-10 boys and Dads in Schools. The RAGE program is designed to give adolescent boys strategies to effectively communicate with adults and peers without aggression. Dads in Schools encourages males to be actively involved in their child's education. When I advertise these programs I run the risk of people gaining the totally false impression that the school has problems with student social skills and behaviour. These programs come into the school to make us even better than the exceptionally high standards we currently set.

We have purchased the additional computer equipment written about in previous newsletters but we are waiting delivery. I am in the process of obtaining quotes to convert the store room in room 12 to a mini computer lab to house six top of the range computers allowing students to be extended in terms of computer applications. I sometimes wish the world was not as technology driven but the reality is we need to have the facilities to allow students to be extended to give them the best possible chance of employment.

Parent teacher evenings are an opportunity for parents to discuss the progress of your children and strategies for continued improvement. Partnership building for the benefit of your children is the key to helping your children gain maximum success. These interviews should not bring surprising or possibly upsetting information because the schools communication mechanisms should have made parents aware of major concerns well before these interviews.

During my career I have many conversations with parents concerned about their child's academic progress. Your school has a goal of allowing children to achieve their potential whatever this may be. This is why we differentiate and adjust curriculum to suit the individual and provide extra-curricular activities. If your child's teacher can tell you that your child is trying hard and improving, what else could you possibly expect from your child? All children have different strengths that need to be celebrated. I would like to put out the challenge for fathers to attend because it is very important that children see dad as part of the learning process. I realise that this is a very busy time on farms but I encourage dads to come to parent teacher interviews.

NAPLAN is scheduled for 12-14 May. These tests are targeted for Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. It is a common test across the state that allows schools to identify areas to target and allows us to measure skills growth between the years. Please encourage your child to do their best in these tests as it helps us to effectively plan. These tests do not measure your child's potential for success in life they are a snapshot of how they perform in this test on the day. I learnt very early in my career that academic success is not the only criteria for success in life. Often those children with self-motivation, ability to self-reflect, and a high degree of common sense are the most successful.

Late last week we finally gained approval to replace our phone system. The process has been long and a little frustrating at times but as usual the office staff have worked around the problems and continue to provide outstanding service. We are receiving a better system than we had before because continual improvement has to be our goal

across all areas, even the phone system. Unfortunately the new phone system will lead to the redundancy of four pigeons, two cans and a length of string.

Last week I wrote about children being excessively exposed to adult images and concepts. Young children do not have the cognitive capacity to rationalise these images and conversations sometimes leading to excessive levels of anxiety in children. It was pointed out to me last week as well that all the stories on the early news were negative. I am not saying children should not be exposed to the realities of the world, but the negativity of the early news is adult reality not the world of a primary school aged child. When your children have had breakfast, washed their hands and face, made sure their bags are packed and homework completed for school (in most houses you would need to wake from your dream) but maybe instead they could watch ABC 2, or even better, reading a book is a better option than breakfast current affairs television.

Inserted in this newsletter is a small survey to help with school planning. We are trying to determine the level of computer equipment and skill in the community. Ultimately I want to investigate the possibility of running some parent / community classes after hours in the school if staffing and funding is available. Obviously if it is not warranted in the community I will not go through the process. Please complete the survey and return it by the due date. This survey will be used for internal school planning and all information will be confidential.

As far as possible we will be running the Carnival in line with PSSA and CHS Athletics Regulations. The Individual Age Champions will be determined by using the following points system 1st 8 points, 2nd 6 points, 3rd 4 points and 4th 2 points. In Primary the following events will be included Discus, Shot Put, Long Jump, High Jump, Championship Race, 200m Final and 800m. In Secondary the following events will be included Discus, Shot Put, Long Jump, High Jump, Javelin, Championship Race, 200m Final, 400m, 800m and 1500m.

- As in previous years, the children are to come to school as usual on both days.
- All students from Year 3 to Year 12 will be participating in the carnival as well as any student in Year 2 who is 8yrs old and has been training during sport.
- Ms Downes class will walk to the oval later in the morning. Their age race will be at 11.00am followed by the Juvenile Championships, the relay and long jump
- Students are to wear sports shoes in all events. No spikes in Discus, Shot Put and Primary 800m events. Spikes are not to be worn to and from events.
- All Primary and Infants children will have their age and house marked on their hand in Texta. This is to assist officials and will be done by their teacher.
- Students are encouraged to wear house colours. (Mitchell - Blue and Oxley – Red).
- In throwing events students may not be throwing the exact weight they will use at the next level.
- Students must compete in the age race and one other event to be eligible for the relay team
- If the carnival is going to be postponed due to wet weather, an announcement will be made in the morning on 2PK and ROK –FM radio.
