Principal's Message

This week is lawn bowls state finals Monday and Agriculture students leaving for *Merino Whether Challenge*, *Merino Whether Challenge* continues Tuesday, *Merino Whether Challenge* Wednesday and 9/10 *Mock Crash Friday*. This is a very busy week at the school but that is typical of public education and particularly this school.

Congratulations to the organising committee of the Trundle Show. The amount of organisation required for such an event is enormous. People who have not been involved do not realise the complexities of *Workplace Health and Safety*, *Safe Food Handling* just to name a few of the government regulations that can cause complications. I hope the show continues for many years to come as our rural institutions are constantly and unnecessarily under threat. It was very pleasing to see the amount of our students achieving prizes in various categories. Our *School to Work* students achieved **first and second place** in the welding section and many of our students won art and cooking prizes. The sheep race constructed by our *School to Work* students is of exceptional quality and most of all practical. I am sure the boys could build another one for a local farmer for a donation to the school. Hint!

This year is the first year the school has taken part in the *Merino Whether Challenge* in Dubbo. This involves conditioning and displaying sheep in a competition format. The winner of the competition I believe is the school that can improve the wool and meat value of the animals the most. This would seem reasonable as it is the basis for successful farming. Congratulations to staff Mr Blake Ridges, Mr Richard John Grady and parent Mr John (Boydie) Aveyard for providing students with the opportunity to take part in this competition. In addition, thank you to the students for the deep belly laughs I have had watching students trying to lead sheep, a truly unnatural act for an animal that must be truly the dumbest creature on the planet.

Staff members constantly make the effort to provide additional activities for your children. These both enhance their learning and enjoyment of school. I am



very proud of the staff at this school as they are always looking to improve the school rather than simply working to their job descriptions and doing the minimum to get by. Commitment to extracurricular events involves staff giving their own time to YOUR children. Staff members are not paid overtime; extra activities are provided through their goodwill and their passion to see students learning.

In the last three years there have been massive changes in this school in terms of subjects, facilities, staff, extra-curricular activities and expectations. No changes could have been possible without the willingness of the staff to embrace positive change for your children. Change will continue to happen as that is the nature of my management of the school. I do not believe something is done well because that is the way we have always done it. The very definition of insanity is continuing to do things the same way and failing. However, the culture within this school will allow the school to benefit from change rather than to be afraid of change. I hope people realise that this school is not the norm. Other schools struggle to encourage staff to take sporting and other extra curricular events but this school continues to provide more year after year. The reason for this is the 22 people who work at the school and they should be congratulated and respected in the community because they are certainly relied upon.

An important improvement in the school has been in our Creative Arts Department under the guidance of Mrs Leanne Budd, Mrs Kim Williams and Mr Chris Orr. Continuing with this improvement is the purchase of a professional quality drum kit, additional guitars and headphones. This will allow the music room to be more inclusive and extension activities to occur. To assist with art we are constructing additional display spaces so the quality of art work produced in the school can be seen by all. Last week I taught a Year 7 music class and one student went home with a

headache. Could be telling me to leave it to the professionals. I still think AC/DC' *Back in Black* is a classic despite student disapproval.

Additional shade covering is a goal of the school. However, I would like it to be constructing rain cover now. However, a generous gift to the school has allowed us to sign the contract for the construction of cover over the Primary assembly area. I hope to have this project finished by the end of next month in time for the hot weather.

Last week was the Gobondery/NARRAF Athletics Carnival. Once again Trundle Central School students performed to an exceptional standard (results in the primary report) with several moving on to the next stage. The outstanding results in athletics recently are an indication of the excellent coaching provided in the town and the school spirit that is currently in the school. One of the first things I did when I became Principal was remove any reference to this school being a small school from documentation and conversation. I believe you can only be described as small if you allow yourself to think small. Students in Trundle can achieve as much academically and in extracurricular activities as their minds and ambition lets them.

This school supports the charter of parent and spectator behaviour originally developed by the NSW Junior Rugby League. The charter is long but a summary is, if you want to act in a fashion that causes tension at an event or embarrassment to the school or students, you are not welcome at the event. If this means you withdraw your child from the event, I am willing to accept this also. This is because I know the fastest way of eroding staff goodwill is for them to have to manage parents at sporting and cultural events as well as students. It is not a staff member's role to mediate between adults. Thankfully, this school does not have a big problem with spectator behaviour but others do across the state. The definition of a spectator at a sporting event is someone that watches and encourages not a person who dominates or pushes his or her opinion. The teacher is in charge whenever your children are at a school event. The Principal of a school has the power to place an Enclosed Lands Act upon parents. This act includes all school activities not just the internal grounds of the school. Again, as with most things, we are lucky in

Trundle but I will have no hesitation to impose this act upon members of the public who misbehave at school activities.

NAPLAN is a diagnostic tool not a complete judgement of a school. Believing that your school is operating well because of NAPLAN results alone is like a car owner saying one of their four tyres is not bald so my car is a flash one. At Trundle Central School, we are not so simplistic. The school has achieved some outstanding results but we still realise that we still have work to do to develop the best holistic educational model for your children. One aspect of our school plan concentrates on lifting results across all subjects towards the highest bands. This is a three-year plan consistent with the NSW Premiers priorities for education and the NAPLAN testing cycle. This year's NAPLAN results indicate that we are ahead of our expectations in achieving this goal. For example, we have students in the highest bands of reading for the first time in three years in both Years 3 & 5. This places them in the top 10% of the state. In Year 7 some students have achieved Band 9 in literacy and numeracy with a quarter of students in the highest bands. This is an outstanding result. In Year 9 we have achieved students in Band 9 for Grammar for the first time in three years.

Robbie Stokes deserves a mention separately as he has achieved Band 10 in numeracy placing him amongst the top students in the state. This is an outstanding achievement for Robbie and validation that the Mathematics teaching in this school is exceptional.

To be eligible for the winter award the nominee must have been a volunteer with the club or association during the period from April to September 2017.


