# Principal's Message

**T**his week Years 3, 5, 7 & 9 will be sitting the *Trial Online NAPLAN Test*. This test will determine the readiness of the school to undertake the real on-line NAPLAN test in 2018. In addition, this week on Friday is the Year 12 graduation dinner in Dubbo. This is always an occasion with mixed emotions for staff and students as school has come to an end and the scary world of extra study or the workforce is fast becoming a reality. The school has been blessed with the quality individuals that make up this year's graduates. Each is different in their personality even the identical twins Norma and Erica but all outstanding individuals.

This week we were given the go ahead to replace the eaves and gutters on the back of the library building to stop it leaking during rain. Obviously, it has not been a problem this year.

Last week we had a visit from the New South Wales Minister for Aboriginal Affairs, Early Childhood and Deputy Minister for Education, Hon Sarah Mitchell. I am very grateful that Ms Mitchell drove to Trundle, which is significantly out of her original itinerary to view our school. This was an important opportunity to display the wonderful facilities and programs available at this school and discuss issues in an informal environment. Ms Mitchell was very generous in her praise of our school and listened to our plans for improving the services available to our children especially in the area of early childhood education. Visits by such high profile people do not happen by chance it takes considerable behind the scenes organisation. I thank Mr Mark Pietsch and the Forbes National Party branch for their assistance in facilitating this opportunity.

Last week I viewed on Netflix's the Trundle Small Town Revival program. It is amazing the progress Trundle has made since the program aired for the first time. There is now very little rental accommodation available or houses for sale and

the numbers of the school have risen from 92 to an expected 126 next year. This is a good story for people to promote Trundle.

There is one small piece of misinformation in the community at present. Children need to be enrolled in school before their sixth birthday. However, they can enrol in school before they turn five as long as they turn five before the end of August in the year they start school. I do not prefer children to be at least five before they start school, even if I did, the enrolment policy is very clear.

This Tuesday a senior properties officer will visit the school to complete the final stage of the tender process for the construction of our netball/tennis court. This is exciting as we can see the light at the end of the tunnel in relation to this long process. After the court is constructed, the *School to Work* students will look at landscaping requirements and the construction of shade covering. This will be yet another facility Public Education provides for the community of Trundle.

On Wednesday 11<sup>th</sup> October, which is the first Wednesday back after the break, our High School students will be given the opportunity to attend a workshop presented by the Blackdog Institute Sydney. This workshop and other activities are designed to raise awareness of teenage mental health and provide students with information about support services available. The whole of secondary are invited to attend. If you feel you do not want your child to attend this opportunity alternative lessons will be conducted at school.

The format of the Principal's message will be changed to information transfer only. I thank the numerous people who have written to me or phoned over the years praising the newsletter.

The following checklist covers hazards found in typical rural workplace situations. It is not designed to cover all of the risks on a farm but to help you to get started on the process of identifying the hazards around you. You should involve your employees in filling out this checklist.

**If you mark a No to any of the following, you need to take action to eliminate or control the hazard.**

### Chemicals

Is there a register of hazardous substances used on the farm?

Are Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) available on the farm for those using hazardous substances?

Do all chemical containers have the correct and readable label affixed?

Are the users of farm chemicals trained (and certified for fumigation) in the safe use of those chemicals?

Are appropriate respirators, gloves, safety glasses and clothing provided when using chemicals?

Is safety equipment regularly inspected and maintained as recommended by the manufacturer?

Are chemicals stored in suitable containers (eg. do not use food or drink containers) and kept in a secure location?

Are all flammable liquids (Class 3) stored away from ignition sources?

Are procedures in place to handle chemical spills?

Are fire extinguishers located near chemical/fuel storage areas?
