Trundle Central School students were acknowledged for their academic and sporting achievements last Wednesday during our Annual Presentation Assembly.







Each day I was assigned to a new team. The duties varied depending on which team you worked with.

#### An overview of my week is as follows: Monday—Waste Management Team

- Checking Sewage Plants and understanding how they work
- Garbage collection in Perisher and Charlottes' Pass in a 'one of a kind' garbage truck

#### Tuesday—Roads Team

- Observed roads being graded, reported damage to roads
- Seeing the destruction that was caused by the recent fires and how long it takes for the environment to recover

#### Wednesday—SOS Team


 Looking for endangered species, setting up grids and documenting how many species were in that area

#### Thursday—Trails Team

- Walked stage three of a tree-day hiking trail, stage three went from Perisher to Charlottes pass. It was a 12km hike that took 7 hours.
- Reported any mistakes that were made with construction and marking out the trails for future hikes
- Seeing amazing view of Thredbo Valley. (these trails are not yet accessible by the public).

#### Friday—Snowy River Association

- Worked at Schlink Pass alongside a builder. The builder works for the National Parks and restores the old drovers huts.
- Discovered the original trails which the drovers made to connect the huts to the trail which the drovers brought their cattle along.

Scoring top points come from swimmers who improve on their own best times significantly (by more than 2 seconds) and/or by improving their best time in more than one event each week. So, continue to swim to your absolute best each week and who knows, you might see your name published!

A Reminder to those swimmers who have been regularly coming to Squad Training – this will be on again this Wednesday afternoon (8<sup>th</sup> Dec) from 4 - 5pm with Mr Burley encouraging swimmers to increase their endurance and race fitness in his session.

For anyone considering bringing their swimmers along, please be aware that the training session can be quite demanding, with most sessions requiring swimmers to complete something like 1400m (or 56 laps) worth of swimming almost continuously for an hour. The intention of this training is to develop the required fitness and stamina for those intending to qualify in competitions outside of the weekly Trundle Swim Club meets e.g. NSW Western Region or State swimming carnivals. Training will also help to improve swimmer's times each week in Club meets, however, if your swimmer is not at the required level for Mr Burley's training - have no fear! You can also simply go to the pool as much as possible and encourage practicing of strokes, or swimming as many laps as they can manage. This regular practice will also improve their fitness and their performance each week.
