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Principal's Message

I am responsible for keeping every child who attends this school and employee safe. I aways act with an abundance of caution, especially during COVID outbreaks. This is because of the demographics of our community. Trundle will lose many community treasures if an outbreak of COVID enters the hospital or Brookview units.

Children do not suffer from the symptoms or side effects from COVID as much as adults. They are transmitters to others, however. It absolutely amazes me a few vocal people find the thought process of keeping children safe challenging. It is also disappointing many of the current vocal Facebook warriors would struggle to even find Trundle on a map. I will explain, not apologise, for the decision made in consultation with executive, to exclude parents and spectators from this year's swimming carnival:

- In the week up to the 9th of February, 2 days before the swimming carnival, Parkes our major service centre had 165 new cases of COVID. Parkes and Trundle have had outbreaks of COVID consistently during this outbreak also. I cannot believe our community is immune from infection considering the number of people commuting every day or because the venue is open air.
- Every adult working for the Department of Education is vaccinated and undergo rapid testing weekly. I cannot guarantee members of the parent body or community attending the carnival have this standard of community responsibility. I decided I was not willing to accept this level of risk to your children and the community.
- The layout of the Trundle pool is common entry, toilets, and canteen. If parents were placed in a separate area, they still would meet children from other families in these

areas of the pool. Also, placing parents or community members in one area, many of which would not normally have social contact with each other is creating an environment for community infection rather than a COVID prevention strategy, I believe.

- Over the last two years considerable face to face learning has been lost because of widespread or localised spread of COVID. Considering the above points, the school should do everything within our capacity to reduce this risk of cases in the school.
- The current educational setting for this school is no un-necessary visitors. It is an absolute contradiction to enforce this rule on school campus, but then allow parents and community members at the carnival. The feedback I have had from other schools and venues is, it has been very difficult to encourage appropriate adult social distancing at carnivals. One school even reported parents and community members entering the marshalling area despite clear instructions not to. I believe this is totally unacceptable considering the current COVID outbreak.
- Our school had exclusive access to the pool. The advice received from Department of Education and Health is, **if schools have exclusive access to the pool the condition of no un-necessary visitors applies**. It is at the discretion of the principal to vary this condition. I have decided not to vary this condition. I also point out that the no parent and spectator condition has been on the school Facebook page for a considerable period (first days of school) and was in our newsletter.
- I do not manage other school communities. I will not be influenced by the vocal few or people making personal attacks. I ask the school community to always be aware of extra agendas behind some people's comments.
- People outside the school community have questioned the wording of my intention to call police if people refuse to leave the venue when directed. This is normal school practice if a person enters the school against the COVID setting or school policy and

and refuses to leave. This has been my stance for a considerable period. I did not write parents will be arrested for attending the carnival. This was a convenient inflammatory interpretation by people pushing an agenda.

Prior to the carnival I received credible information that a member of the Trundle community was intending to attend the carnival with the sole intention of causing disruption. My direct information in the post and strong stance I believe reduced the chance of this occurring. Again, it is my responsibility to keep your children safe.

I need to make decisions for the whole school. I am very sure many of the people criticising me for having the courage and level of care to exclude parents and spectators from this carnival would also be extremely critical if an outbreak occurred in the community linked to the carnival.

Every student who attended the carnival should be proud of their effort and participation. The atmosphere of the carnival was happy and calm. This was especially throughout our High School students. I sometimes wonder if a small percentage of parents place unnecessary pressure upon children to achieve. Maybe trying to improve We are well advanced towards achieving these their self esteem by living through their children, rather than allowing young people to acknowledge that participation, fitness, and fun is always the primary goal of school sport. Our students should also be proud of the condition the pool was left in as pool management did not have to pick up any rubbish or return furniture after the carnival. This must be a rare occurrence after a school event.

It has been an outstanding start to the 2022 school year. I think the best in my 33 years of teaching. Students are extremely settled across the whole school. This allows all staff to focus on achieving our school's three strategic directions.

These are:

- Literacy and Numeracy development
 - Increasing the number of children in the top two bands of NAPLAN.
 - Increasing the number of Aboriginal students in the top three bands of NAPLAN.

- Implementing our Literacy and Numeracy whole school plan.

Positioning our school as a leader in pastoral care and services to the community.

- Providing the pastoral care services that are lacking within the town.
- Providing a venue for health or pastoral care professionals to service the whole community.
- Increasing awareness of youth mental health.
- Providing students with the strategies to cope with periods of poor mental health. - Providing numerous pathways to success at the individuals student's level. These are often outside the confines of the traditional classroom structure.
- Improving the instruction and delivery of stage 6 (11/12) programs.
 - Improving HSC results.
 - Video conference delivery.
 - Professional development for teachers.
 - Provide numerous alternative pathways through Yr 11/12.

strategic goals despite the challenges of COVID. This year we can have guest speakers back in the school for essential curriculum reasons and programs. Students will be exposed to many additional pastoral care programs, especially in promoting positive mental health, drug and alcohol awareness, road safety and building and maintaining positive peer relationships.

Your school has numerous quality remedial programs for students struggling with curriculum access. Our current plan maintains this focus, but also directs considerable resources to those students in the middle and upper bands of the school. Our goal is to give these students the strategies, skills and self confidence to improve Literacy and Numeracy and reach their potential. I write self confidence because it is often a lack of confidence rather than ability that holds children back.

Over the last two years we have allocated considerable money and staff time to converting the library from a traditional passive space to an active enquiry-based learning hub delivering STEAM. This is Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics. The work done by the STEAM team consisting of Mr Lynn, Mrs Sanderson and Mrs P is outstanding. This space has transformed the library. This team is also creating a mindset that encourages innovation in the classroom which I believe is essential for academic. social, and cultural growth. Every teacher in this school is allocated an additional \$1000 for innovation to provide experiences for children not Last week I was reminded of two pieces of advice. readily available in Trundle.

Our school has developed strong relationships with cricket clubs in Sydney. The outcome of this partnership is a considerable stock of quality cricket gear to give away. This will occur this week or early next week. In fourth term we will run coaching clinics using professional coaches and players for our students.

Children should attend school each day the school John Southon is operational for a whole day. Children can only miss school for illness, or a reason accepted by the principal. This school has an outstanding attendance rate across all years. Indeed, last year we had over 30% of our students attending 100% of the time. This year again students achieving 100% attendance will go into a draw for a IB HiFi voucher to the value of 200 dollars. This does not mean a student cannot be sick. This is justified absence. What it does mean consistent attendance and effort will be rewarded.

The school gym has been added to the regular playground duty roster. Over the holidays significant work was completed to make the school gym a more functional educational space. There is considerable evidence to support the positive educational and health benefits of physical activity. Staff have also observed during the COVID lockdown the physical fitness especially endurance of many children has declined. I thank staff for giving our older more mature students the opportunity to self-refer to this program.

Last year we subsidised driving lessons for students. This was an acknowledgement of the cost of young people obtaining professional tuition

and a recognition that a licence is essential for employment or further study when you live in Trundle. This year we are enquiring about an instructor coming out to Trundle for whole days to give students lesson concentrating on those students in Year 12. This is a very expensive but a service to our community. This year we will also be booking the Rotary driving simulator. This machine simulates various driving conditions making young people aware of the level of danger associated with poor decisions such as drink driving and speeding.

One from a local legend who is unfortunately suffering poor health now. He told me do not worry about what people think in Trundle because the same person who is patting you on the back one day is kicking you in the backside the next. lan Anderson the best Principal I ever met told me only take criticism from those you trust for advice. Wise words from two vastly different but equally good people.
