Welcome back to Term 3.

Hopefully, all reports have made it home and families have been able to reflect on the results our students have achieved. Please remember we would welcome any conversation on how we can work in partnership to improve student outcomes.

This semester our staff are working on improving our reporting to be more in line with the state. It is one of the few drawbacks of having small cohorts of students is that it makes the grades aspect of the reports difficult to convey meaning. As a school we have been reporting within our cohort rather than against the set General Performer Descriptors. As we work on standardising our internal grades so that they match the external grades students receive at the completion of Year 12, parents may notice some differences in our future reports.

Generally speaking, a student who is performing at the "usual" level of knowledge and competency for their year level would be considered to be "Sound" and would receive a "C" grade. This would be normal for all students at that age. To receive a "High" (B) the student needs to demonstrate a "thorough" knowledge and understanding and a high level of competence in applying skills, and be able to apply these attributes to most situations. Finally, an "Outstanding" (A) needs to display an extensive understanding of content.

Year 12 have commenced their final term of school!! We will be regularly checking in with our students as they approach the end of their school time.... forever. There will be plenty for our students to do as they approach their HSC and our mentors will be working with them to ensure they are all coping with the added pressures of Year 12.

This semester we have made some adjustments to our Welfare System to enable us to discern between our students better. In particular, we

have strengthened the link between the submission of assessments on time and the students' welfare level. We have spoken with the students and will continue to support them as we implement these changes.

This semester will include major examinations in some subjects in Term 4. To assist our students in attaining results that fully reflect their academic potential and effort they will be given study guides this week to assist them in setting up a timetable to allow them to maximise their time outside of school. Teachers will provide students with the content of the exams next week, and study guides and materials by Monday of Week 4.

Years 11&12 will have the second Western Access Program camp next week. We will be departing from school at 7 am on Monday, and returning on Wednesday in time for buses hopefully. All students have received a note and a packing list.
